### Kid's Koncert Drums Up Future Musicians








On January 31st of this year, nearly 1,100 TUSD fourth graders were met by twenty-three TACFA and ENCORE volunteers as their buses arrived for our annual Kids' Koncert at Beckman High School. TACFA underwrites the cost to transport these students to Beckman High School's Performing Arts Center for two 1-hour concerts highlighting the talents of the Beckman Orchestra, conducted by Jim Kollias, as well as the Beckman Wind Ensemble, led by Matt Bausman. Kids' Koncert is a program designed with young students in mind as they learn about various sections and instruments of band and orchestra, concert manners, and the prospects for entering the musical programs as they enter middle and high schools in Tustin Unified. The orchestra played several fun and engaging selections from Disney's Beauty and the Beast, Rey's Theme from the Star Wars movie series, and Felix's Mendelssohn's String Sinfonia. The Wind Ensemble continued with Avenger's Endgame, Pirates of the Caribbean, and Guardians of the Galaxy. A big surprise descended upon the students as Beckman's prestigious drumline marched down both sides of the performing arts center. Students sat entranced as they listened to the powerful drumbeats and clever arrangement of the marching band's talented drumline!



### **Broadway in the Park**



So much has changed in the last 20 years. In the year 2001 gas was \$1.46 a gallon, no one had heard of Covid-19, Zoom meetings, social distancing or Broadway in the Park. Having to cancel what was to be our 20th show was extremely disappointing, but it also gave us the time to look back on all that has taken place since our very first Broadway in the Park. Much like the year 2020, it has been one heck of a ride. Since the year 2001, close to 80,000 audience members have sat under the stars to enjoy the magic of a Broadway musical. 389 songs have been performed by more than 500 different actors, 16 of whom sung while flying above the stage strapped to a harness. We have had twice as many pirates on stage as nuns, two dozen gangsters, only one king and not a single princess. We have had one real dog, an actor dressed as a dog, a crocodile, a President as well as a man-eating plant. It is beginning to look like Broadway in the Park and the year 2020 have a lot in common. Although there have been many changes over the years, there is one thing that has not changed, our commitment to our mission. We would like to extend a heartfelt thank you to all the sponsors, audience members and volunteers who have supported our mission and made Broadway in the Park possible. We look forward to seeing you all next year.
