In our darkest moment, the Tustin community came together and lifted us up. Without being asked, people showed up to help us dismantled the

equipment in the park. One after another, sponsors and donors told us to keep their money, because TACFA and the arts were important to them. Ticket and table buyers donated back the price of their purchases and sent us notes of encouragement that bolstered our spirits, and vendors did not hesitate to waive their cancelation fees. Although the cancelation of Broadway in the Park was devastating, it also gave us an overwhelming feeling of appreciation to the people, businesses and the City of Tustin. We never would have made it through without you. We truly cherish all of you!

CALLING ALL SCHOLARS!



TACFA will award scholarships in 2022 to graduating seniors who reside in the Tustin Unified School District. Six (6) TACFA Barbara Benson Memorial Scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors who will major or minor in a Visual or Performing Arts at a college, university, or other professional training institute beginning in the Fall 2022. \$500 Scholarships are available for qualifying seniors planning to attend a community or junior college and enroll in fine art courses.

Students must submit an application, a letter of recommendation, and an online art portfolio or performance video highlighting the candidate's expertise in their chosen field.

Students must maintain a 3.0 GPA to qualify. Selected candidates will be interviewed by the TACFA Scholarship Committee in April. A copy of the application and detailed instructions will be available on the TACFA website beginning in mid-January 2022. Applications will also be available through the counseling offices at the TUSD high schools.

CREATIVE SIGNAL PROJECT

In cooperation with the City of Tustin Parks and Recreation Department, TACFA has been approved to install graphic art on two traffic signal boxes—one at B Street and First Street; the other at El Camino Real and Sixth Street. The City made a public call for designs for its "Creative Signals Project." TACFA's committee solicited TUSD high school students for their ideas with an award of \$500 for the best representation of TACFA's Broadway in the Park theme. Two TUSD seniors, Charles Manuel Chua of Tustin High School and Ivanna Tjitra of Beckman High School were selected for their graphic arts submissions. The project was approved by the City's Public Art Commission as well as the Tustin City Council. Keep your eyes out for the "new" traffic signal boxes in early 2022.
